NYS and NJ are continuing to receive supples of vaccines as they become available and distribution them. As a result, it is important to be regularly checking all websites to determine vaccine appointment availability. Governor Andrew M. Cuomo announced New York State is launching a new pilot program to begin administering the Johnson & Johnson's single-dose vaccine to eligible New Yorkers during the overnight hours at the Yankee Stadium, Javits Center and New York State Fair Mass Vaccination Sites.

HOW DOES THE JOHNSON AND JOHNSON VACCINE DIFFER FROM THE OTHERS?


J&J's vaccine uses a different technology from those of Pfizer and Moderna, which use a gene technology called messenger RNA. The J&J vaccine uses a harmless type of virus known as an adenovirus, which can cause the common cold but is modified so that it doesn't cause disease. Instead, it is engineered to carry a piece of genetic code that instructs the body's cells to make something resembling the spike protein from the surface of the coronavirus. This in turn induces an immune response that can protect a vaccinated person if they are later exposed to the real virus.

**Clinical trials of the vaccines were conducted with different sample sizes and virus variants in various periods of the pandemic, complicating direct comparisons of efficacy based on percentages alone. All three of these vaccines have demonstrated effectiveness in preventing COVID-19 hospitalizations and deaths.
